Before a paper can be published in an IEEE Computer Society Transactions, it is necessary for the principal author to signify intent to comply with the Society's Mandatory Overlength Page Charges policy:

Independent of any voluntary page charges, the IEEE Computer Society assesses the authors of papers that exceed the regular paper length limit a fee called Mandatory Overlength Page Charges (MOPC). The regular paper page length limit is defined at 14 formatted transactions pages, including references and author biographies. Any pages or fraction thereof exceeding this limit are charged \$200 per page. However, regular papers may not exceed 18 formatted transactions pages unless approved by the EIC. Authors will be notified of any assessed charges when galley proofs are sent for review. Payment must be sent at the time galley proofs are approved by the author.

The author will be notified of any assessed charges when galley proofs are sent for review. To better estimate the number of formatted transactions pages of the article, authors are encouraged to format their final submission using one of the IEEE Computer Society templates available at: <http://computer.org/author/transguide/transstylefiles.htm>. As indicated in the submission guidelines, papers must be formatted using 10 point type, 0.5 inch margins, and page count does include references and author biographies.

The mandatory page charge fee must be paid or the paper must be reduced to fit within the allowed number of journal pages as indicated above. This form must be completed and returned to the IEEE Computer Society before an accepted paper can be placed in the publication queue.
